

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 115 km/h, and central pressure of 994 hPa


Present Movement

West Northwestward at 15 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 150 km from the center





Oct / Nov: Get South, out of Typhoon Zone! Cruising Back South to Davao & Oceanview Marina











































Slogging North to Singapore October
